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basic tonic solfa concepts is an illustrative guide that tries to simplify and smoothen the learning path for tonic solfa notation users it brings under one package the easiest methods and techniques of yielding the best choral performance through proper notes or music reading interpretation and a well focused training program the book acts as a guide for both lay and professional music instructors as well as choristers by drawing upon the basic components of the best choral performance it is useful for both ensemble performances and solo singing

looks at choruses not only as a source of music but as organizations that come together for aesthetic social political and religious purposes this volume discusses groups including an east african chorus groups from 19th century england germany and america early twentieth century russian menonites soviet workers clubs and more

solfege and sonority is a guide for teaching music literacy in a choral rehearsal with a focus on the needs of teachers who work with young singers the book lays out teaching sequences for melodic and rhythmic concepts lesson plans and concise strategies for introducing key techniques the individual lessons themselves are short no more than 4 6 minutes each and comprehensive encouraging singers to develop a literacy of rhythm and melody together in 18 easy to use lessons for teachers and conductors and tying the lessons to the teacher s current repertoire longtime choral director and teacher david j xiques has created a practical and viable solution to the challenges of many conductors as well as providing a much needed manual for upper level choral pedagogy courses the comprehensive companion website provides access to videos of exercises worksheets and teaching materials

bringing together perspectives on history global activity and professional development this companion provides a unique overview of choral music

an accompanying compact disk enables the reader to work closely with the sound of african speech and song discussed in the book

the oxford handbook of music and world christianities investigates music s role in everyday practice and social history across the diversity of christian religions and practices around the globe the volume explores christian communities in the americas europe africa asia and australia as sites of transmission transformation and creation of deeply diverse musical traditions the book s contributors while mostly rooted in ethnomusicology examine christianities and their musics in methodologically diverse ways engaging with musical sound and structure musical and social history and ethnography of music and musical performance these broad materials explore five themes music and missions music and religious utopias and other oppositional religious

communities music and conflict music and transnational flows and music and everyday life the volume as a whole then approaches christian groups and their musics as diverse and powerful windows into the way in which music religious ideas capital and power circulate and change between places now and historically it also tries to take account of the religious self understandings of these groups presenting christian musical practice and exchange as encompassing and negotiating deeply felt and deeply rooted moral and cultural values given that the centerpiece of the volume is christian religious musical practice the volume reveals the active role music plays in maintaining and changing religious moral and cultural values in a long history of intercultural and transnational encounters

a candid memoir and a wide ranging look at musical practice by a living legend of carnatic music thinking back after receiving the sangita kalanidhi i came to realise that i was entering a stage where i might eventually sing a film song i had evolved from the person who said i absolutely will not do it sanjay subrahmanyan is the musician of musicians for his mastery of the craft as well as for his intellectual and theoretical depth of understanding of the art an embodiment of rigorous traditional practice and constant innovation he has today ventured out of the world of carnatic music to explore new worlds and new ways of doing things but always with his life in classical music intact as he stands at this crossroads subrahmanyan looks back at his life in music unusually candid and guite ready to look idealised notions about art and music in the eye this is as intimate a view of the world of carnatic music as one is likely to have tracing his own life trajectory from childhood and through the decades as a professional musician subrahmanyan takes a close look at the nuts and bolts of the industry he yanks the veil off the rarefied image of the artist showing us the person who also needs to run a house wishes to earn well and houses ambitions as well as a range of passions beyond his music written in collaboration with the novelist and journalist krupa ge this autobiography is a refreshing portrait of the artist as a man of flesh and blood as well as a rare insight into the musical practice of one of indian music s cult figures

this biography of michael mosoeu moerane 1904 1980 surveys the unique life times and music of the first classically educated african composer in southern africa

sound advice is a valuable resource for college students beginning teachers and experienced conductors of children's choirs it covers the vast array of skills needed by today's conductor and will benefit all choir directors who want their choirs to reach a higher level of artistry this book will be useful on many levels for the college student studying the child voice and elementary teaching methods for the teacher beginning to direct choirs in schools synagogues churches and communities for experienced

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children's choir directors who wish to know more about orchestral repertoire for treble voices conducting an orchestra and preparing a children's choir to sing a major work with a professional orchestra the underlying educational philosophy is sound the author sees development of musicianship through singing as the primary goal of a children's choir program this philosophy differs dramatically from the traditional concept of the conductor as all knowing and the singers as receptacles an outstanding aspect of the book is how the author leads the reader to an understanding of how to teach musicianship developing literacy in the choral setting is a mysterious amorphous process to many conductors but the author clearly outlines this important process with practical suggestions well documented examples and a clear reading style which will reach readers on many levels the comprehensive repertoire skill building sheets and programs for all types of children's choirs will provide teachers with immediate and highly valuable resources

hymns and constructions of race mobility agency de coloniality examines how the hymn historically and today has reinforced negotiated and resisted constructions of race it brings together diverse perspectives from musicology ethnomusicology theology anthropology performance studies history and postcolonial scholarship to show how the hymn has perpetuated generated and challenged racial identities the global range of contributors cover a variety of historical and geographical contexts with case studies from china and brazil to suriname and south africa they explore the hymn as a product of imperialism and settler colonialism and as a vehicle for sonic oppression and or resistance within and beyond congregational settings the volume contends that the lived tradition of hymn singing with its connections to centuries of global christian mission is a particularly apt lens for examining both local and global negotiations of race power and identity it will be relevant for scholars interested in religion music race and postcolonialism

the present reader is a selection of texts on south african music which are chosen not only for their importance or the frequency of citations but with the express purpose of providing the reader with a deep understanding of the music itself consequently there are readings that are chosen because they have been influential but there are also many which though published have not enjoyed very wide circulation there are those which are of obvious historic interest and others which speak to contemporary issues among other things the volume provides an excellent sense of the varying ideologies and approaches that determine the relationship between author and subject the reader is indispensable to scholars and enthusiasts of south african music and it is of great interest to ethnomusicologists more generally it is also an excellent resource for those who do not have immediate access to harder to find articles and is perhaps most vital to

those who are looking to find a way into the world of south african music

the routledge companion to interdisciplinary studies in singing volume ii education examines the many methods and motivations for vocal pedagogy promoting singing not just as an art form arising from the musical instrument found within every individual but also as a means of communication with social psychological and didactic functions presenting research from myriad fields of study beyond music including psychology education sociology computer science linguistics physiology and neuroscience the contributors address singing in three parts learning to sing naturally formal teaching of singing using singing to teach in 2009 the social sciences and humanities research council of canada funded a seven year major collaborative research initiative known as advancing interdisciplinary research in singing airs together global researchers from a broad range of disciplines addressed three challenging questions how does singing develop in every human being how should singing be taught and used to teach how does singing impact wellbeing across three volumes the routledge companion to interdisciplinary studies in singing consolidates the findings of each of these three questions defining the current state of theory and research in the field volume ii education focuses on the second question and offers an invaluable resource for anyone who identifies as a singer wishes to become a singer works with singers or is interested in the application of singing for the purposes of education

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
